Local health departments on June 1 will begin regular inspection and monitoring of more than 2,000 public swimming pools, water slides, beaches, hot tubs and whirlpool tubs in the state, according to Larry Trussell of WECOO/Nicholas County Health Department.

"These inspections apply to all pools and spa facilities except those in private single family residences," said Trussell, assistant director of the state Department of Health Services, Division of Public and Environmental Control, 235 East Main Street, Frankfort, Kentucky 40621. Trussell and other environmentalists from across the state have participated in two-day training sessions on the new regulations and requirements for inspections.
