Senior trip; a senior's delight

On Sunday, April 5, 48 seniors and nine chaperones pulled out of snow-blanketed Carlisle, heading for the sunny beaches of Florida.

As the first major senior trip for students at Nicholas County High School since the 1960s, success and smooth sailing were important.

According to Sue Kirby, a member of the Nicholas County High School faculty and one of the nine chaperones, the trip was indeed a success.

"Nothing had happened on this trip," Kirby said.

"There was no bad apple in the bunch we took on this trip."

According to Kirby, the bus, which held 40 of the seniors and five of the chaperones, pulled out of Carlisle at 1 p.m. Sunday, taking Interstate 75 South for Florida.

However, a van containing the remaining eight seniors and four chaperones pulled out earlier that morning, 10 a.m., and headed west to Bowling Green, through Tennessee and Alabama into Florida.

Kirby, a passenger in the van, said "We wanted to miss the snow that had fallen the

night before by going west instead of south."

According to Kirby, a strange coincidence happened on the interstate outside of Orlando, Florida, at 4:30 a.m. Monday morning.

"We were driving along and we saw a Trailways bus that looked like the one our group had taken," she said.

"As we passed the bus, we saw Mr. Bond (principal at NCHS and chaperone), waving at us."

"It was such a coincidence to meet up with the bus when we left Carlisle at such differ-

ent times and in different directions."

After eating breakfast, the group headed for the Jetty Park Beach, which is up the coast from Cocoa Beach.

After spending several hours there, the group dined "clean clothes on dirty bodies" and toured Kennedy Space Center for over two hours.

Finally, the group checked into Davis Brothers Motel in Orlando around 6:30 p.m.
