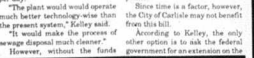

Eye Openers

By Dr. Robert F. Pretzsch, Ophthalmologist. The tennis season is in full swing, but are your eyes ready for the game? A good tennis player uses many different visual skills.

When the ball is in motion, clear distance vision enables you to focus fully on the game. And that clear distance vision (peripheral vision) enables you to keep an eye on your opponent, your partner, and the court's boundaries all at the same time.

Depth perception is a vital vision skill for judging the ball's speed and position, and eye pursuit skills allow you to follow the moving ball. A combination of eye-hand/body coordination helps you get into position for hitting the ball.

On both sunny and cloudy days, good sunglasses diminish glare, so you don't lose the ball when serving or returning a ball.

An optometric examination leading to correction of vision problems can help remove a major barrier to success on the tennis court.
