What is an emergency???

The Nicholas County Volunteer Fire Department met with near disaster, Saturday. The department's primary truck, a 1963 Ford Pumper Truck, went out of commis-

According to NCVFD Chief, Mark Hughes, the truck's engine blew, while the department was responding to a grass fire. The department does have a back-up, as a matter of principle, a 1952 REO, which is on

loan from the Forestry Department and could be recalled by the department, should

the need arise.
This would leave the county with NO FIRE PROTECTION EQUIPMENT.
Members of the Nicholas County Fire

Committee held an emergency meeting, Monday night at the fire department, to discuss some alternatives.

The problem here, is there was no decision made . . . at least no decision of action. As many of you are aware, in fact page 6 of this week's Mercury carries a full page ad, the department has been attempting to raise funds to purchase a new fire truck

The truck will cost in the neighborhood of \$69,000. According to members of the department, there has been about \$35,000 raised for the purchase.

This represents a little over 50 percent of

the total price.
Since the Saturday events, and to some some successions of the county proper fire protection. degree before, there has been some discussion of how the committee and ultimately the department should proceed.

One alternative was of course to buy the! truck . . . and the other was (and IS now) to rebuild the older engine and wait until more funds are raised to purchase the new truck.

Rubel Williams, a member of the fire
committee, was also on the board when the
1963 Ford was purchased, and said once the truck was delivered, donations for the pro-

ject stopped.

Thus, he is not in favor of purchasing a truck until a greater part of the total cost is on hand for the fire department, he said Monday afternoon.

According to Williams' statements Mon-day afternoon, he is in favor of putting a new engine in the old truck . . . to get it back

The argument here is, we have no real county fire protection, right now.

The REO will hit a top speed, according to

Hughes, of about 40 M.P.H.

At top speed, it will take the truck about half-an-hour to cover 20 miles. And no truck
