"The city can't respond to all our runs until we get something done," Hughes said.

"Then where does that leave us?" Stephenson asked of the funds for the new truck. He and Williams estimated the county fire department could only borrow a maximum of \$20,000.

"We can only borrow the amount taken in taxes for the fire department last year," Stephenson added. "That leaves us \$13,000 short this year."

Hughes said the department could pay it off in seven years. "You have to pay \$1,194.75 plus the upshot of the truck a year," Hughes said.

"It all has to be paid back," Williams said.

"The guy from F.M.C. manufacturing of the truck said for us to set it out as a national emergency that they'll lend you a truck until you're made," Hughes said. He said that way the county will have a fire vehicle until its new one is delivered.

"Someone could contest the emergency," said Williams. "If we get a notice on the old truck and use it for six months, we could still get the new one on the truck," said Stephenson.

"What are you talking about in getting a new engine?" asked Hughes.

"Getting a good complete engine," Williams said.

The board then elected to check into prices for a replacement engine for the old truck and also discuss the price at its regularly scheduled meeting November 10.

"My idea is to make plans for a new one truck, but to get this one back on the road again as a backup," Stephenson said.

size of rock and line is not as complicated as it is to build.

"First we have to strip all the topsoil up to 25 feet in the deepest places, and then we drill holes into the rock and use explosives," Eaton said. The crews working the quarry blast the rock loose with dynamite, the loose stone is then piled up with a loader and crushed.

"We then stockpile the rock into different sizes," Eaton said. "We have five sizes of rock."

He said the county uses the rock for the paved roads and gravel roads. "We maintain the gravel roads we have and then use the rock when we are chipping and sealing blacktopping," Eaton said. The blacktopping is done about every day in the summer, in the winter it's too cold.

"The best that you can get is still in the old and you can't do anything with it," he explained. Recently, the rock quarry was limited from being open five days a week to four days by fiscal court. Eaton said Fridays are the only days the rock quarry can be open.

**Section 4: DECLARATION OF A WATER SHORTAGE EMERGENCY**

Whenever the City Council of the City of Carlisle finds that raw water supplies are below the level necessary to meet the normal needs of the population and that serious shortages exist, it shall be empowered to declare by resolution that a water shortage emergency exists. In the event that a water shortage emergency is declared, all water uses set forth in Section 3 shall continue to be prohibited and in addition, the following water uses shall be prohibited:

1. All domestic uses of water shall be prohibited except water necessary to sustain human life and lives of domestic pets and to maintain minimum standards of hygiene and sanitation.
2. The use of water for any swimming pool.
3. The washing of any motor vehicle including commercial car and truck washes.
4. The use of water in any automatic clothes washing or dish washing device including commercial laundromats.
5. The watering of golf courses including golf course greens.
