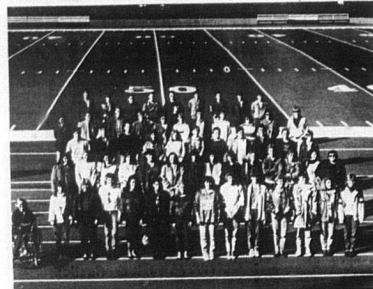

Legislature approves new workman's comp plan

House Bill 1, the Workers Compensation bill passed during the regular session, addressed two major problems an unfunded liability of \$ 7.1 billion in the Special Fund and a benefit program that needed to be reauthorized. The bill passed will raise \$110 million a year for 20 years to pay the unfunded liability and meet ongoing claims. To prevent a similar debt from recurring in the future, the plan restricts the amount of new claims that can be filed. With the special session completed, the legislature now turns its attention toward January 5, and the opening of the 1988 session. Interim committees have only one month left to finish the study of public bills and other matters. The interim period gives law makers an opportunity to profile bills prior to the 1988 session, and some bills are assigned to the appropriate committee for study. The bills passed will have a profound effect on the 1988 session. Just as workers compensation was tough and complex issue during the special session, there will be similar issues to address during the upcoming session. Heading the list may be the state budget. During the interim, legislators have been told the state will fall some \$600 million short of budget needs. And speaking of education, although many reforms have been enacted, there still remains some areas which need to be improved. You can be sure the legislature will be asked to again examine Kentucky's education program at the primary, secondary and higher education levels. The disposal of other state garbage in Kentucky has drawn the attention of the legislature. An interim subcommittee has been studying this problem, and the effect it could have on the state. Two other subjects that will surely come up in 1988 will be prison overcrowding and the juvenile justice code. There are just a few of the problems we will take up in just a few weeks. Social Security Update
Questions and Answers
Q: My mother is about to retire and apply for her Social Security retirement benefits. She is not well. Can she apply for retirement without having to visit the Social Security office?
A: Yes. People who find it difficult to visit a Social Security office to apply for their Social Security benefits, may do so by telephone. Social Security personnel will take the entire application by phone. We will take the necessary information and then arrange to contact the applicant by mail.
Q: My husband was injured at work about 6 months ago. He just recently filed for Social Security disability benefits. How long will it take before we are notified of his application for benefits if approved?
A: Allow 3-4 months. You'll be notified by mail. The actual time it takes to process his claim depends, for the most part, on how long it takes to get medical reports and other information. And if special tests or examinations are required, his claim could take longer.
Q: Which of my children would be eligible for monthly checks if I die?
A: Monthly payments may be made to nondependent children under 18 or 19 if still in high school; or children 18 or over who were severely disabled before 22 and who continue to be disabled.
