Will Snell, agricultural acconomist at the University of Kentucky agrees in a release to the Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service.

**Exports of U.S. cigarettes increased 9 percent in 1986 and have increased a whopping 50 percent so far this year. And leaf exports have increased from 150.6 million pounds by year. Those figures, plus the trend for decreased imports of burley, make the scenario for burley production more positiva-than it has been in several years, Small said.

ures.
Snell said exports have increased because manufacturers have found that smokers prefermore U.S. burley in cigarettes.

According to Snell's report, the domestic demand for cigarettes is estimated to decline, thus making it seem necessary for a stronger world market for burley produc-ers.

Snell added though the world market is improving for U.S. burley, growers still need to be concerned about quality.

Caswell emphazised he felt burley farmers should take a bigger part with what's happening to them.
