This church had not been in use for several years and in 1932 it was torn down. There is a burial ground there. The last known persons buried there were Frank M. Grimes, 1936; Cassandre Prather in 1942; Burch Prather and Mary E. Ritchie in 1945. 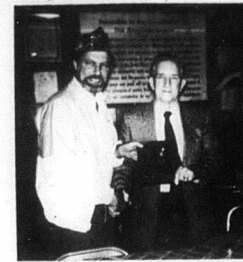
