Johnston rates declined in 75 Kentucky counties between June and July, reflecting the fact that in 1987 that the statewide unemployment rate has fallen below 6.0 percent.
Nicholas County's rate fell from 11 percent to 8.7 with seasonal adjustments.
As the same time, 28 counties recorded higher unemployment rates in July and in seven counties the rates were unchanged from June, according to figures released today by the Cabinet for Human Resources.
Kentucky's jobless rate fell from a revised 9.2 percent in June to July's preliminary 8.8 percent, as many people who had been searching for temporary summer jobs in June dropped out of the labor force the following month.
Nationally, unemployment declined from 6.3 percent in June to 6.1 percent in July. Comparable state and national figures are not seasonally adjusted.
Eighty-four counties had lower rates than in July 1986, 25 counties reported higher rates than a year earlier and Fayette County had the same rate.
The number of Kentucky counties reporting unemployment at 10.0 percent or higher was down from 60 in June to 56 in July. In July 1986, 84 counties had double-digit jobless rates.
