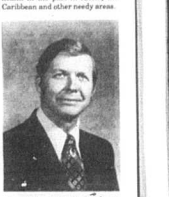

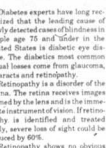

Some guidelines being considered

1. Diabetes between 15 and 30 years of age should have their first complete eye exams five years after diabetes is diagnosed.

2. Eye exams should follow yearly unless otherwise determined.

3. Any diabetic person who takes insulin and is undergoing periodic check-ups should be followed by an ophthalmologist.

4. A pregnant diabetic woman should be examined for retinopathy by an ophthalmologist in the first three months and as often thereafter as indicated.
