This is not the house that Jack built. It is the house John McMorly built.

The house now belongs to Mr. and Mrs. Rick Storm of Carlisle, Kentucky.

Built in 1866 by one of Lexington's great architects, McMorly drew and designed the original plans.

Thomas and Amelia Kennedy were the first to live in this one of many beautiful homes in Carlisle.

Owner of a piano company that was located in Central Kentucky, J.H. Templeman had the beautiful art glass windows installed in the front hall installed.

Templeman also had the beveled glass doors, and a porch with milled pillars made of concrete installed.

These particular features still remain in the house today.

Mrs. Storm added when she and her husband were looking to buy a house they liked this home, and the longer it sat empty, the more in need of repair it would be.

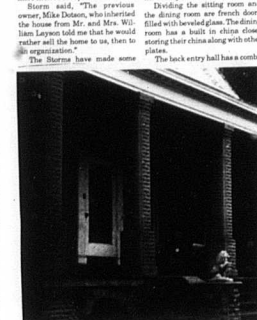

The Nicholas County basketball team took a 7-0 lead of momentum, but was held to a 14-13 decision to Berea last Friday night.

The Jackets looked on top in the first quarter after stopping Berea on downs at the Pirates' 47 yard line, and three plays later Todd Day hauled up with 77 yards for a 30 yard completion to give Nicholas County a first and 10 on the 15.

ty, but this one slipped away. There was a fumble for possession in the end zone and Nicholas County had the ball first and goal at one minute.

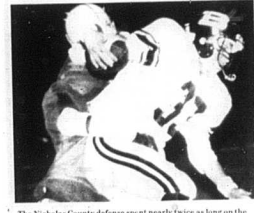
"We just didn't gain it," said Head Coach Bobbie Barr.
