### Alma Curtis leaving KT

In 1964, Wayne Blumate, then production manager at an apparel making company called Giffin Manufacturing, was faced with a dilemma.

The largest customer, Jobkey International, had just decided to make the switch from cotton to nylon, which in turn could create problems for Wayne's assembly line, unfamiliar with the special problems of handling, cutting and sewing this new fabric.

Wayne did what smart managers do—he called in the Marines, i.e., the best sewing machine operator he knew.

That operator was Alma Curtis. Over the years Giffin Manufacturing became Blue Green Industries, which in turn became a stepping stone for Kentucky Textiles.

The two constants through all these years were Wayne Blumate and Alma Curtis. Today Wayne Blumate is Chief Executive of Kentucky Textiles and Alma Curtis is Vice President of Manufacturing.

And in April, 1988, Alma will say goodbye to the job to which she has dedicated 27 years of her life.

In the course of her career, Alma has been responsible for managing all plant operations, including cutting, sewing and packing, worked in customer relations and supervised as many as 2000 employees. And has done so, as her co-workers will testify, with outstanding proficiency.

One thing Alma emphatically will not miss when she retires this spring is keeping up with the main stream of light deadlines, that is the lanes of production managers everywhere.

"The only way you can feel really good about your job is knowing that at the end of the week that you're shipped out all your product, right on schedule," said Alma. "We set ourselves some very demanding goals, and when we accomplish them... We break out the champagne!"

But it hasn't been all popping corks and pats on the back for Alma and her troops.
