Fehr tossed a 2-yard TD pass to tight end Martin Pennington with 9:49 left in the second quarter to make it 6-0. Scott Gillum's extra point attempt was wide left.

Maggard finished with three completions in four attempts for 36 yards.

Nicholas County's baseball Jackets saw last week end with a 10-6 mark, losing three games, while winning one. The week's play opened with a game against Rowan County.

The Jackets jumped out to a 6-0 lead, but allowed the Vikings five runs in the bottom of the sixth as Rowan County took a 6-0 lead. The game, William V. man connected for two hits, while Todd Day hammered a home run and collected three.

Against Montgomery County, Nicholas fell short again, dropping a 4-1 decision.

Tip Fryman had a homer for Nicholas County.

Against Fleming County, Nicholas battled back from 4-0 deficit with two in the bottom of the first and two in the bottom of the second to tie the game 4-4.

Neither team could push a run across the plate until Fleming County plated a run in the top of the seventh and held on to win, 5-4. Fleming County was aided by four Nicholas County errors.

Scott Allison led Nicholas County with two hits and three RBIs.

In the week's last game, Nicholas County rallied from its losing ways in posting a 13-7 win over Powell County. The Jackets forged a 3-0 lead after two innings.

In the top of the fourth, though, Powell County struck for five runs to lead 5-3.

In the home half of the fourth, Nicholas picked up a single run to trail 5-4.

Powell County continued to score well, and added two in the top of the fifth to lead 7-4.

However, the Jackets were not to be denied, as Nicholas County put five runs on the board in the bottom of the fifth and four in the bottom of the sixth to post a 13-7 win.

Day muscled a home run in the game, while Rodney Hedges and Daniel Brown each collected three hits.

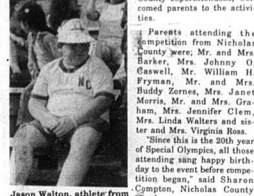

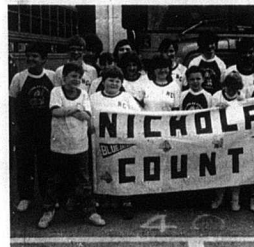
