For thousands of college students attending Morehead State University this fall, the 1988-89 academic year will begin with moving into residence halls on Saturday and Sunday, August 20-21. Registration will take place on Monday and Tuesday, August 22-23, with classes beginning on Wednesday, August 24. President and Mrs. C. Nelson Cole will kick off Welcome Week (August 21-23) Activities with the annual street dance and ice cream social in front of their home on University Boulevard on Sunday, August 21, from 8:30 to 11:30 p.m.

On Monday, Student Government Association will sponsor an outdoor concert featuring Xanthus. From 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, evening music artist Rob Reider will be performing in the Adron Doran University Center. Tuesday evening, Program Council is sponsoring the cultural classic, "Rocky Horror Picture Show," at 8:00 p.m.

MSU and PC will co-sponsor and Under the Boardwalk seafood feast complete with fresh shrimp and oysters, on Fields Hall Lawn, Wednesday, August 24, from 4 to 7:00 p.m. The annual Lambda Chi Alpha Fraternity Watermelon Bust will be held Wednesday at 4:00 p.m. on the Laughlin Health Building Lawn. PC will host mentalist Craig Karges at 7:30 p.m. Thursday in ADUC 0811.
