Eye Openers

By Dr. Robert F. Pretzsch, Optometrist TAKING CARE OF YOUR GLASSES Treat your new pair of glasses with tender, loving care. They have been prescribed and adjusted especially for you. Don't like them? Try them or wear them. That can disturb the fit of the frame, which, in turn, can disturb the position of a multifocal lens.

Use both hands to remove your glasses. Don't handle the lenses themselves and never put the lenses face down on a surface. In this way you can keep your glasses scratch-free.

Clean your glasses with plain soap and water. Plastic lenses should be wiped with soft, lint-free tissues that are designed to be nonabrasive.

When not wearing your glasses, put them into a case before placing them in your handbag or jacket pocket. If your glasses get uncomfortable, or the vision appears off-balance, don't try to adjust them yourself. You may need a simple professional adjustment.
