Former Kennedy press aide remembers November 22, 1963

BEATTVILLE, Ky. (AP) - Malcolm Kiduff clearly remembers the horror and tears on reporters' faces when he told them that President Kennedy was dead.

But the reporters wignambled for that briefing at 1:31 p.m. on Nov. 22, 1963, were not the first to get confirmation of the tragedy from Kiduff.

A short time earlier, Kiduff said he was seeking permission to make the announcement and walked into the heavily guarded room at Parkland Memorial Hospital where Lyndon B. and Lady Bird Johnson were.
