## George escapes from back window, after lights fail

 At 4:30 in the morning November 19, Jamie George was heading out to do some deer hunting. It was raining and the night before George had a little trouble with his lights.

Suddenly, the lights went out again and George found himself in water as he was approaching a bridge at the end of Case Run Road.

Somehow he made his way out the back window of his truck, a three-quarter ton four wheel drive Ford pickup. In the water, George was able to feel his way to higher ground with a cable Donnie Bromas installed to keep his horses from crossing the creek.

The truck was washed down the creek and stalled. "As sure as I'm standing without that cable," said his mother, Bessie Doyle, "there was some confusion about whose job it was to maintain the bridge."

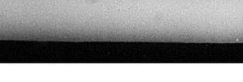
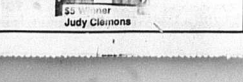
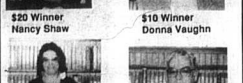
