RICHMOND A late surge wasn't enough as Nicholas County rallied from 13 points down in the last quarter, but lost to Richmond Madison in overtime, 73-68, last Saturday night.

The Jackets grabbed the opening tipoff with Brad Allison getting the ball driving to the basket and scoring. Madison scores at 7:03 in the first quarter, to over the score 2-2.

Back at the offensive end of the court, Daniel Brown hit jumper with a three pointer. Madison countered to cut the margin to 5-4.

Madison went ahead converting a steal to lead 6-5. After a Brown miss at the free throw line, Madison was able to increase its lead to 8-5.

Andy Anderson brought the Jackets within one, grabbing his own missed shot and putting the ball back up and in.

Madison went to the charity stripe to add two free throws. Collier Mathes knotted the

score with a three point shot on Nicholas County's next possession.

The six-point lead affair continued as Madison edged back to a two point lead on an inside shot.

Acorn Mathes tied the score with an eight foot jumper.

After Madison had gone back into the lead, the Jackets turned the ball over and the Jackets' defense could not stop the Purples from adding to the advantage.

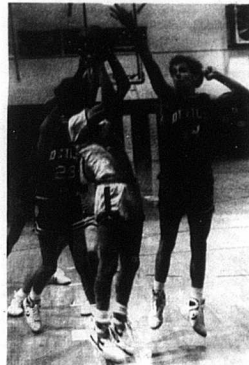
