Star leads way to Savior's birthplace



St. Luke Chapter 2

Next meeting, 9 a.m., January 10 Nicholas Court hears landfill report

Nicholas County Landfill Manager Phillip Howard appeared before Nicholas County Fiscal Court, December 14, to explain operations at the landfill and problems there.
The county, according to Howard, is operating as quickly as possible to meet an order from the Environmental Protection Agency concerning the landfill and its operation up to standards.
All garbage must be covered with dirt - three feet down - and top soil placed on the that.
"Once we got the equipment operating properly - or as near as possible - we've been working on satisfying the EPA."
Keeping the county operated facility in compliance should, "Prevent us from getting any more fines," said Nicholas County Judge Executive Reese Sneed.
The county has been fined for not having the landfill in compliance.
"I think you're doing a pretty good job out there," Nicholas County Magistrate Floyd Russell said

during the meeting.
There was some questions concerning Howard's handling of the men working under him - and if in fact they're doing what they're supposed to - however, no specific directions were given by the court as to actions which should be taken.
Magistrate Orville Atkinson did say Howard should closely monitor the men on reporting time - not being late - and that men should not leave work stations early - before the end of the shift.
Atkinson and Magistrate Melvin Fryman questioned Howard presented a report showing - at his best ability to get estimates what it would cost the county if it had gone outside to have some of the repair work done on the machinery at the landfill. His best estimate guess was nearly \$38,000 for labor alone, not including any parts which would be purchased.
In addition, Howard told court the EPA doesn't recognize down time for equipment, explaining, "If the job that is being done,

a bulldozer goes down, they (the EPA) expect you to have another one ready to run."
