Legislative Perspective By Adrian Arnold

Last week members of the special session of the Kentucky General Assembly completed their work to propose a lottery.

A reliable and effective lottery commission has been established through the legislation fashioned in the three weeks of concentrated effort by lawmakers.

The Legislature is to be commended for their extraordinary efforts in completing this streamlined measure in such a short time.

Cooperation between members of the House of Representatives and the Senate has been outstanding, as well as the Governor's willingness to discuss all aspects of the issue.

I believe that the mechanism designed to operate Kentucky Lottery is the best of its kind anywhere.

We have investigated other states' programs and lottery and vendor experts have testified before the State Government Committee.

As I discussed last week, major details of the lottery legislation include the creation of an independent corporation to manage the lottery.

The corporation will be headed by a board of directors and president of the corporation.

The legislation provided for legislative oversight and subjects employees of the lottery and those retailers participating in the lottery to security checks.

The General Assembly also set in motion a plan to initiate a Vietnam Veterans bonus that will be funded by revenue realized from the lottery.

In anticipation of a special session in 1989 to address major weaknesses in the state's education program, a 15-point plan to improve all aspects of education by the year 2000 was unveiled by members of the Joint Committee on Education.
