In the next few weeks, Lerman Brothers of Carlisle will close its doors for the final time.

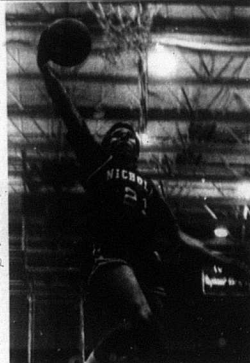
