Ky. Attorney General Cowan hears proposals from election fraud task force

The Election Fraud Task Force, created by Kentucky Attorney General Fred Cowan, presented its final report on the state election process.

The 60-page report handed to Cowan in mid-January, includes proposals that would alter the way Kentucky elections are administered and reviewed and would provide stiffer prosecution of those who violate election laws.

Independent *Tele-Tax* an investigation by the Attorney General.

Penalties for election law violations upgraded to felony.

More frequent and systemized purges from voter rolls of the names of convicted felons and persons who have died, moved, or have otherwise become ineligible.

A ban on electioneering changed from within 50 feet of a voting machine to 1,000 feet from the building the machine is located in.

The use of challengers selected by candidates be discontinued.

To guard against "bribe" corrupting the system, the task force recommends sweeping changes in the way Kentucky's elections are administered.

Key to that, in the proposal to shift election responsibility now held by the State Board of Elec-

tion to the Secretary of State.

At the local level, responsibility would be removed from the County Board of Elections and placed with each County Clerk.

To provide citizens more in the election process, the task force urges a shake-up in the way precinct voters are chosen.

Three out of the four precinct officials at each polling place would be selected at random by computer. Their election day duties would be mandatory, similar to jury service. They would be trained and supervised by a Election Sheriff, who would be certified by the Secretary of State's Office.

The Election Fraud Task Force began its work November 19 and held eight meetings.

The 20 members heard testimony from vote buyers and sellers, state police, county clerks, state election officials, judges, sheriffs and others.

the Ecology Club and Student Council as half of the cost of a beautification project at the high school;

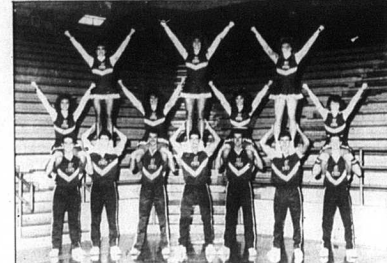
approved the use by the National Guard of the Nicholas County High School grounds as an alternate assembly area;

Eye Openers

YOUR BABY'S EYES

If your baby is less than six months old, it is not unusual for his or her eyes to cross or turn occasionally. Your baby has not yet developed full eye muscle control.

If the crossing or eye turn continues, however, or increases in frequency, the baby's eyes should be examined. Children do not outgrow crossed-eyes, or eyes that turn outwards to the side of the head. The earlier treatment is started, the better chance exists for straightening out the eyes.

Many cases of crossed eyes, or eyes that turn out, can often be corrected through a combination of prescription lenses and vision training. Any visual acuity weakness will be corrected at the same time that the eyes are being straightened. In time, the child is taught to use the two eyes together, so that the eyes remain straight and in alignment. Surgery is only recommended when other methods of correction are unsuccessful.
