Lady Jackets take big win over Augusta, 56-41

CARLISLE: Nicholas County Lady Jackets pulled out another victory Monday night against Augusta, 56-41.

Nicholas broke into an early lead in the second quarter, ending the half with a six point advantage, 20-17.

Closing the third quarter, Louise Rawlings brought down the rebound, passed to Nancy Ward for the free throw.

Bussell closed the third period by driving through the lane and took it to the hole.

Nicholas led both teams going into the final quarter, 34-27. Cindy Hamilton opened for the Lady Jackets with a jumper from mid-range after an assist from Bussell.

Jackets drop to Estill, 79-56

The Nicholas County varsity basketball team dropped to Estill County February 12, 79-56, at Estill.

The Estill County Engineers pulled into an early lead in the opening quarter.

It was a Kelly Brookshire pass to Todd Day for the basket which closed out the period with the Jackets trailing, 28-4.

Following time from the line from Day, the Engineers came on strong, hitting an eight-point run.

With 3:06 left of the half, the Jackets lagged behind by 16.

Brookshire answered with a jumper for two.

Brookshire followed this up with a three pointer.

The Jackets came back after the missed Estill shot and Day put up two to cut the Estill lead to nine, 39-30.

Estill pulled more ground, closing out the half with an 11-point advantage, 43-32.

The Engineers straddled their lead in a 23-point run at the end of the third period, 65-40.

The Jackets were outscored 22-8 in the third quarter.

Fourth quarter action saw the Jackets attempt to cutting into the Estill lead to no good.

Estill closed out the final minutes of play with a comfortable 23 point win, 79-56.

Jackets Head Coach Lee Cruise said Estill was one of the better teams Nicholas has faced this season.

With 4:03 left, Nicholas caught Augusta asleep with a Warner long pass to Bussell for the basket and the decisive lead, 44-32.

The Lady Jackets sealed the victory, 66-41, in the final minutes of play.

"We played well, the shots fell for us," said Lady Jackets Head Coach Barbara Kenney.

The Nicholas County girls hit 50 percent from the field, and 68 percent from the line.

Bussell was the high scorer for the Jackets with 33 points after hitting 13 of 18.

Warner followed with 22 points; Rawlings, six; Chris, three, and Hamilton with two.

The Lady Jackets travel to Augustine County February 18 and Richmond Madison February 22.

The Lady Jackets' final home game is February 24 against Pendleton County at 6 p.m.

Kenney said the Lady Jackets' three face Harrison County in the first round of the District Tourney February 26, 6:30 p.m. at Harrison.
