Bluejackets drop to Sayre, 48-46

 The Nicholas County girls Varsity Bluejackets couldn't pull out a home-court win on February 20 against Lexington Sayre.
 The Sayre Spartans jumped out onto a 16-point advantage at the half and held the upper hand with a 48-46 victory.
 The Spartans jumped on top early in the first quarter after a David Demaris three pointer, 7-4. Sayre added to this with six more points, Nicholas Todd Day the only Jacket to answer with a basket.
 The Spartans capitalized a four-point offensive holding the upper hand on the scoreboard and burnt the Jackets.
 Sayre better than doubled Nicholas' on the boards, heading into the second period, 14-4.
 Day led the Jackets' second quarter charge with a three-point basket.
 Andy Anderson followed this up a minute later, cutting the Spartans' lead to six, 17-11.
 Sayre answered back twice, doubling its advantage to 12, 23-11.
 Brookshire hit the final Jacket's point of the half with a 4-39 remaining.
 That it was all Sayre with seven additional points, ending the half with a 16-point advantage, 29-12.
 Third quarter saw the Jackets rally, outscoring the Spartans 18-8. The Jackets Brookshire closed out the period with an easy basket, narrowing the Spartans' lead to six, 37-31.
 Nicholas' rally ensued into the final quarter.
 It was on a Day three pointer that sent the Jackets to tie with the Spartans, 42-43.
 With 1:36 remaining of play, the Spartans took advantage of the charity, tapping five points, breaking ahead of Nicholas, 48-43.
 Brookshire fouled out with 1:27 on the clock.
 Again it was Day, with 28 seconds left, with a three pointer to close the gap, yet the Jackets couldn't follow up.
 Day fouled out with 12 seconds remaining and with the Jackets game high of 17 points.
 The Jackets couldn't regain the offensive control for the tying basket, eventually falling 48-46.
