N.C. freshmen fall to Pendleton Co., 56-44

Collier Mathias broke the scoring tie with a drive through the middle for a basket. He was fouled and hit at the line for a three-point play.

Pendleton played a perimeter game with baskets by Brian Simpson, Bobby Simpson and Jeff Jones.

Shad Tibbs hit a long jumper for Nicholas from just below the three-point mark with 1:27 to play. After Mathias on the lead to one with a field goal, Brian Hillender put the Jackets up by one going two for two at the line.

George Joseph closed the first quarter with a shot from the inside to tie it up 11-11.

Mathias opened the second quarter with a fade away jumper from the foul line area. Pendleton tried a transition game and scored baskets by both Simpson and Brian Taylor.

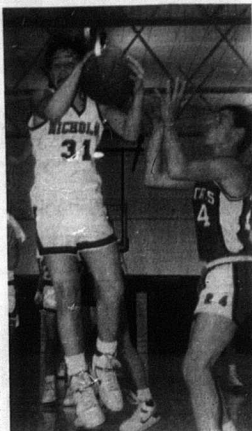
After a Nicholas streak, the freshmen rallied and set the lead to five with baskets by Hillender, David Albert and Tibbs. Wildcats were on top in the first half, 22-22.

Robert broke open in the deep right corner and took the tie for Nicholas to open the second half. Hillender took down the offensive rebound and put up the last Nicholas basket of the third quarter.

Meanwhile, Pendleton compounded a lead with constant outside shooting, 55-28. Hillender opened the fourth quarter after an assist by Mathias scored the next basket, with a short jumper and led Hillender for the two tie after a rebound pass on the defensive end.

Tibbs took it from the perimeter three consecutive times with 2:28 left on the clock.
