**Circus music leader  
dies in Sarasota, FL**

Merle B. Evans, 85, died December 21, in Sarasota, Florida.  
He had been director of the Ringling Brothers, Barnum & Bailey  
Circus for more than 50 years.  
Evans, a Kansas native, traveled the world with the renowned circus.  
For a time he resided in London, Kentucky.  
He had been the director from March of 1919 to the end of the 1969  
season. He was active in his profession, even after retirement.  
Beginning with the circus in Madison Square Garden, he never  
missed a performance, supporting 18,500 performances. The record to-  
day represented appearances in front of more than 165 million people.  
Before joining the "Greatest Show on Earth," he was the bandmaster  
for the Miller Brothers 101 Ranch Wild West Show, which started Buf-  
falo Bill Cody.  
W. B. Griffin, remembers Evans well.  
"I had the pleasure of meeting Colonel Merle Evans in 1933, and it  
has been a long and lasting friendship.  
"I had the pleasure of presenting him with a Kentucky Colonel  
Commission from former Kentucky Governor Lawrence Netherberry  
and the band played first and in the background, 'My Old Kentucky  
Home' Griffin recalled.
