SOCIAL SECURITY

A new law required employers to pay Social Security tax on the full amount of covered tips their employee receive, according to Tom Corstner, Social Security manager in Mayville. Under the old law, employers paid Social Security tax only on the amount of tips deemed to be waged for purposes of meeting the Federal minimum wage level. As under prior law, the employer is responsible for keeping a record of cash tips and, if they total \$20 or more, reporting them to the employer by the 15th of the month after they have been received.
