The Reverend Dr. Albert W. Sweazy of Winchester, formerly of Carlisle, recently received an honorary degree of doctor of laws at commencement exercises at Union College, Barre, Vermont.

The degree was conferred by the Board of Trustees and Faculty of the college in recognition of contributions and distinguished service to the United Methodist Church, and in appreciation of his support of the high education work of the church.

The Reverend Dr. Sweazy, son of a United Methodist minister, was born in Nelson County, Union completing his bachelor of arts degree at a salary.
