NOTICE OF ELECTION

This blank envelope should be placed inside the envelope you use to mail your ballot. Your name and address must be legible on the outer envelope. Failure to provide this information will render your ballot invalid. Only one ballot may be voted in person or by mail by any voter. Votes in envelopes containing more than one ballot will not be counted. Ballots and envelopes may also be obtained from your local FmHA Office.

The date of nominees for Harrison/Nicholas Area County Committee are listed in the ballot below. The qualifications of persons voting are described in the "Voter Certification Statement". For further information regarding voting and voter eligibility, see the County Office listed above. FmHA elections are open to all eligible voters without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, age, political affiliation, marital status, sex, and handicaps.

ELECTRICITY

Carolyn Dotson enjoying job with Kentucky Utilities

In today's society, it is considered by many that young people are pushed into thinking or even making a decision concerning a career they want to pursue after they are out of high school.
However, many of those same high-school age students never look at every aspect of the jobs which they are considering.
They may also be told that satisfaction is what most people look for in their line of work.
Carolyn Dotson, Customer Service Representative at Kentucky Utilities, will vouch for this belief as she considered all the possibilities and avenues before choosing her present occupation and has found satisfaction in doing what she does best - helping others.
Dotson's job covers a wide range of customer service areas.
In her work, she covers Paris, Cynthiana, Georgetown and Carlisle.
Some of her duties include giving presentations on safety and energy conservation when using appliances to school economics classes and different organizations.
"I also consult with builders on the new construction of homes, businesses and other commercial buildings and about how appliances can be installed to conserve energy and be as safe as possible," said Dotson.
The basic program she works with deals one on one with customers and in helping them solve problems with their bills and appliances.
She often estimates the size of new heating and cooling

equipment based on the families needs.
Dotson said, "I am sometimes called to find the source that is causing the customer's bill to be abnormally high."
She added, "We are a customer oriented group and we feel our customers and service are very important."
Nicholas County as a community and the company are not linked in an even more special way.
Dotson explained further, "The community and company are tied together as they are currently working with the Main Street Project Committee to beautify and preserve Main Street."

"It's never the same two days in a row," commented Dotson on her job.
Dotson not only works at her job, but is very involved in other programs.
"The service representative doubled her duties as she was this year's president of the Nicholas County Academic Boosters Club with many programs being initiated during her year."
The on-going computer project for the school was finalized and new projects were started.

This year brought about the first edition of the "Christmas in Carlisle" area contest which depicted a scene of Nicholas County High School.
Under Dotson's term the second edition ornaments project were begun and they will depict the old Carlisle High School.
Dotson said, "We hope to continue the programs that have been initiated in the past few years such as the Enrichment Program which serves the high school."
The Enrichment Program brought members from Synop Incorporated (A dance troupe based in Lexington) to perform for the high school.
Nicholas County High School hosted this year's Regional Governor's Cup Competition and the Academic Boosters were responsible for the lunch and concessions.
The boosters, under Dotson's leadership also organized and sponsored the Academic Excellence Award Program and Reception for those high school students who received points for extracurricular academic activities.
Most recently the Academic Boosters held a student-faculty basketball game for the entire high school.
Other activities such as the Future Home-maker's of America also involve Dotson's expertise.
