State officials meet

"We want to identify the areas with the most critical problems and target where we can do the most good," said Little. Scattered rainfall in several areas of Kentucky had Thursday did little to relieve the drought.

"I've never seen anything like this," said Homer Hurst, a Fleming County farmer. "They say 1930 was bad, but I don't see how it could be any worse."

The National Weather Service predicted a return to dry conditions after Thursday's brief showers.

The Farmers Home Administration announced last Thursday that it would sell hay from farms in its inventory as a drought-relief measure.

Mary Ann Barron, state Public Director, said hay from 30 farms in 16 counties would be sold by bid as soon as possible. She said a time and date would be announced soon.

The state Department of Agriculture is also seeking hay for Kentucky cattlemen as pasture and grazing areas continue to dry up because of the lack of rain.

"We're definitely going to head it," said Roger Nesbitt, a state agriculture official in Frankfort. "We've already called eight states, but they are in the same shape we are. I don't know where we're going to get it."

Hurst, who also raises livestock at his farm about 3 1/2 miles from Flemingsburg, said he has planted corn for the third time this growing season.

"There's just enough moisture to start germinating and then they dry out," he said. "We're really suffering. We're so dry it's going to take two to three inches to do us any good."

"To hard to give up hope, but it's getting slim."

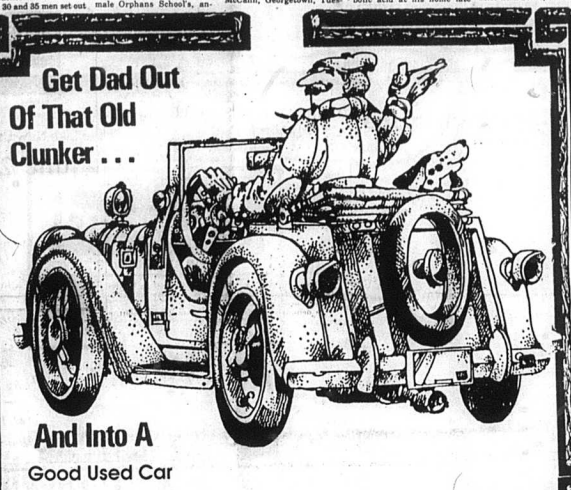
