Authorization not needed for certain medication

Kentucky physicians who pre-
scribe a specific class of drugs to
treat arthritis in Medicaid-eligible
patients will soon be relieved from
having to obtain special state au-
thorization.

Governor Wallace G. Wilkinson
announced that the Cabinet for
Human Resources will elimi-
nate the requirement that that
prescriptions for these drugs
known as single source (one pro-
ducer, non-steroidal, anti-arthritis
drugs) be prescribable by the
state in order to be reimbursable
under Medicaid.

"One of the main thrusts of this
administration's health care plan
is to emphasize preventive medi-
cine wherever possible," Wilkin-
son said.

"Having studied the previous
needs for preauthorization, I feel
these changes are necessary in the
past two years to justify this move
as both financially and medically
the best interests of Kentucky's
Medicaid system and its clients,"
he pronounced.

Legislation proposed in 1986
and again in 1987 authorized the
use of a class of non-steroidal,
anti-arthritis drugs on Kentucky's
Medicaid Drug Formulary as an
official list of drug treatments auto-
matically covered by Medicaid.

Due to the higher cost of single
source drugs as compared to al-
ternate treatment with aspirin or
other over-the-counter drugs, the
establishment of a process by which
physicians obtained preauthorization
for these drug prescriptions in
cases where the option of treat-
ment with aspirin or other drugs
was not advisable.

Human Resources Secretary
Harry J. Coward, M.D., said the
cabinet's new recommendation is
based on several factors, including:
- Preauthorization delays since
establishment of the process have
been less than one-half of one per-
cent.

- It is estimated that placing
single source drugs on the formu-
lary would increase the current an-
nual payment under preauthorization
of \$874,000 by no more than
\$995,000.

- Personal and administrative
costs of the preauthorization pro-
cess to physicians and the Medi-
coid program would be eliminated.

- There is increasing evidence
that (a) early use of these drugs
reduces hospitalization and
prevent or delay joint destruction
and (b) prolonged aspirin usage
can produce negative medical
side-effects in some patients.

Based on the best available
data, he has the additional cost
of placing these drugs on the
Medicaid formulary and the con-
tinuing concerns of Kentucky
physicians and Medicaid patients
over the availability of these
treatments lead to believe that
his action should be taken im-
mediately," Coward said.

Coward said the change will
become effective March 1. The ac-
tion will affect an estimated 16,000
prescriptions currently covered by
Kentucky's Medicaid program
each year.

Gore, Bush win big
in Nicholas, state;
Super Tuesday vote
low in Nicholas, Ky.

CARLISLE - Nicholas County voters apparently went along with the state in casting votes during Tuesday's Super Tuesday Preference Pri-

mary. Gore, from Tennessee and the man endorsed by Governor Wallace Wilkinson, took about 41 percent of the state's vote with nearly half the large vote in at 71.5 p.m. and in Nicholas County Gore took 52.55 percent of 70 votes comprising 611 19 precincts with 370 votes and one absentee.

Michael S. Dukakis, Massachusetts Governor endorsed by former Kentucky Governor Martha Layne Collins, was second in the state with about 21 percent on the same reporting time, and captured 15.16 percent of the Nicholas County vote.

Dukakis ran second in nine precincts, tying for third in one with the late Governor James Taylor.

Jackson and Dinkabaker tied in the Moorefield precinct, each obtaining four votes.

On the Republican side, Vice President George Bush captured 58 percent of the state's Republican vote (at the same reporting time), while Nicholas County voters favored Bush with 65.65 percent of the tally.

Revering the overall county returns, (percentages in brackets) Dick Gephardt 71 votes (10.00%); Jesse Jackson 59 (8.30%); Richard Kay 1 vote (0.14%); Gary Hart 51 votes (7.28%); Paul Simon 12 votes (1.7%); Anthony B. Martin-Trigona 1 vote (0.14%); Michael Dukakis 197 (28.11%); Bruce Babbitt 14 votes (2.0%); Al Gore 371 votes (52.55%); Lyndon LaRouche 4 votes (0.57%); uncommitted 12 votes (1.72%). There were 707 votes cast in the Moorefield precinct.

Republican Harold Stoen, Pete Dalton, and Alexander Haig re-
ceived no votes, and there were no uncommitted votes cast. Jack Kemp received 1 vote (1.42%); George Bush 28 votes (4.0%); Bob Dole 16 votes (2.27%); and Ed Edwards 5 votes (0.71%). There were 66 Republican votes cast in the county. Several Republicans listed on the ballot for Super Tuesday have already withdrawn from the chase for the Republican nomination for president.

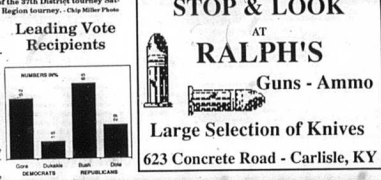
With 433 registered Democrats and Republicans in Nicholas County, only 702 votes were cast, representing 17.38 percent of the available votes in the county.

Statistics, figures at 7:35 showed about the same turnout in many of Kentucky's counties.

Questions have already arisen from the general public concerning the estimated \$3 million spent on Kentucky's participation in Super Tuesday, with a primary election for many states and local offices set for May 24.
