**Nicholas County Chess Club making all the right moves this school season**

Nicholas County High School has been busy anxiously this school year and that includes the continuation of a very popular Chess Club.

Last Friday, the Chess Club, organized and coached by Peter Chamness, traveled to Richmond Madison to compete in the South Regional Chess Tournament.

The tournament, a competition involving nine schools, awarded Nicholas County's Senior chess division third place and the Junior High division first-place trophy.

Chamness said of the Senior division's effort, "I am frankly surprised and very proud of them, considering that this is only our second year of competition. I am also shocked at how much the students in the Senior division have improved."

"When we began this last year, we did go to the regional and the only points we had were one point by forfeit."

"We met in the Richmond Invitational Chess Tournament November 7, and only took home fourth out of four schools participating."

"In this most recent tournament anyone could see the vast improvement as we beat five schools and took first place in the 'half-point' said Chamness.

The senior division accumulated half and one-half points. For overall points, the judges only must four of the highest cumulative, individual scores.

One point is given for a win, one-half point for a draw, no points for a loss and each player gets in four matches.

Who plays whom is determined by a draw board.

Chamness explained, "The better players play the power ones last or the first match."

Those that have the same amount of points after this play each other so that the players are more comparable."

Individuals that accumulated points in this year's regional included Ronnie Berry with two one-half, Erin Mathes, two points.

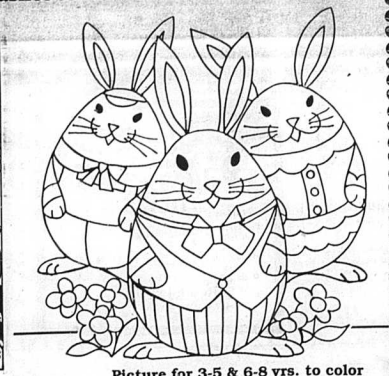

Woodall began her career at Nicholas County High after moving from California.

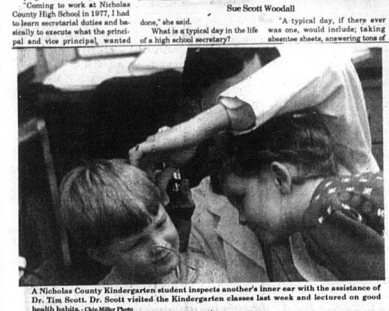
"I lived in California for 18 years and moved back here in 1970 to be close to my mother in her later years," Woodall said.
