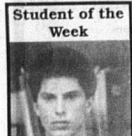

Nicholas County Irish roots sees rich, fruitful history

The church sees Brenda Lawrence and Mary Katherine Knapke as the first Irish Catholic priest ministering the sanctuary.

Other changes and improvements included forming a Parish Council as the Vatican Council II gave a voice in the government of the local church, purchasing three more bells, painting the church and rectory, enlarging of basement, purchasing the land around the building and sending out letters of appeal.

During the years that followed the Reformation of the St. Louis Province came to the Diocese of Covington and set up a mission house in Carlisle. In the early 1860's, a time of great change and improvement in the United States as a whole, also brought great change in the church.
