The Executive Budget, House Bill 823, has been passed by the House of Representatives and is awaiting a vote in the Senate.

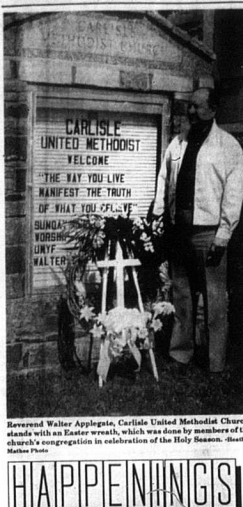
