Inspection Period  
FOR THE PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT ROLL  
The Nicholas County property tax roll will be open for inspection from May 9 through May 21, 1988. Under the supervision of the property valuation administrator or one of the deputies, any person may inspect the tax roll.  
This is the January 1, 1988 assessment on which state, county and school taxes for 1988 will be due about September 15, 1988.  
The tax roll is in the office of the property valuation administrator in the county courthouse and may be inspected between the hours 9:00 and 4:00 weekdays and 9:00 and 12:00 Saturdays.  
Any person who wishes to appeal an assessment must file a written letter or petition with the county clerk within the above period of time. This letter or petition must state the reasons for appeal, identify the property in question, and state the taxpayer's estimate of actual fair cash value. (KRS 133.120)

PROTECTING YOUR EYES  
Is your child protecting his or her eyes when engaging in active sports? Almost 90 percent of the estimated 187,000 eye injuries that occurred in 1987 could have been prevented by wearing protective eyewear. And that's especially true in racquetball, where the high speed of the ball is causing many serious eye injuries to the unprotected player. Here are just four ideas to consider:  
● Use the sturdy frames with polycarbonate lenses. Polycarbonate lenses resist shattering better than other types.  
● Try frames made especially for sports, with padded bridges and attachments for a headband.  
● If you are comfortable in goggles, especially designed for sports protection. Prescription lenses can be put into this type of goggles.  
● Wear an eye-glass guard over regular contact lenses or glasses.
