**Train rides set**  
 May 22, 29-31

Those wanting to board the excursion train ride from Paris to Mayville in Carlisle will be able to do so on MAY 22, ONLY.

The excursion will run from Paris to Mayville and return, May 22, while on May 29 and May 30, the runs will be from Mayville to Paris and return.

On May 31, rides will be available from Mayville with stopping points in Paris, Lexington, and Louisville.

Rides may also be taken from Paris to Lexington, and Louisville or from Lexington to Louisville.

According to Joan Conley, of the Nicholas County Historical Society, railroad officials would not allow passengers to load and unload in Carlisle, except for the MAY 22 trip.

The cost of the trip from Paris to Mayville and return (from Mayville to Paris) is \$25.00. Although the round-trip tickets will be \$25 for the Paris to Mayville and return runs, according to Conley, tickets will be printed in such a manner as to allow friends or relatives to use one half of the ticket. One person can ride in one direction and another take the return trip.

The May 22, 29 and 30 trips will get underway at 9 a.m. and return at 5 p.m.

On the May 31 trip, bus transportation will be available at a nominal fee.

Ticket order blanks are available at Hopkins Drug and Carlisle Drug in Carlisle.

The trip is sponsored by the Buffalo Trace Tourism Commission.
