For deer season Workshop is scheduled at Maysville, November 5

A public workshop will be held Saturday, November 5, at the Maysville Community College to discuss the changes in the 1988 Kentucky deer season. The morning will begin with an outdoor country breakfast from 8-9 a.m., followed by the workshop from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

There will be a \$10 charge for the breakfast and workshop, sponsored by the Maysville Community College and the Maysville Area Vocational School Agriculture Department.

Items to be discussed include new regulations, deer hunting safety, deer management, landowners rights and land leasing to deer hunters.

Hunters will also have the opportunity to purchase a single hunting license and deer permit during the breakfast hour.

The panel for the workshop includes Sgt. Billy Jolly, state conservation officer, Steve Benson, northeastern district wildlife biologist and Jim Dalk, hunter training officer for the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources. 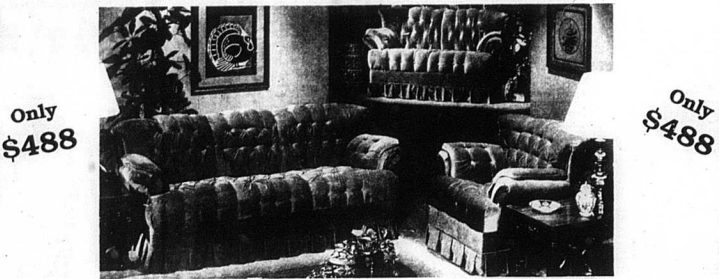
