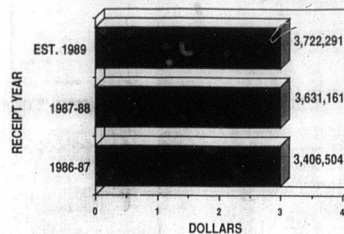

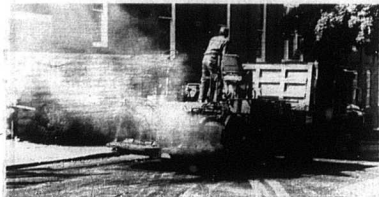
RECEIPTS FOR NICHOLAS COUNTY SCHOOLS

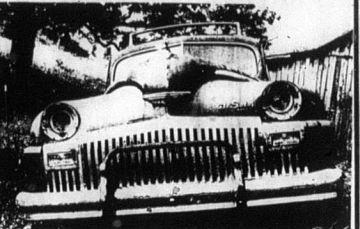
