Hopkins seeks sixth term as U.S. Representative

If my American Express card goes over the limit, then I get a call - and we as a family have to stop using that card.

The federal government doesn't appear to be willing to work that way. If we have \$550 billion to spend, we'll spend a trillion and be in the hole \$150 billion.

"That's no way to responsibly operate a government or any business," Hopkins said. "I have always favored and will continue to do so, a balanced budget bill."

A member of several committees, Hopkins views his tasks as very important.

"I am working hard to earn the trust of the people - and I believe I have done that."

As a member of the Agriculture Committee Hopkins said, "Some of toughest times I face are legislation and action against the tobacco industry - Kentucky largest cash crop, but I will continue to do my best for the people," he concluded.

"It is an opportunity to vote as a representative of the people. I treat it as a valuable commodity."

"Before I vote on any program I ask myself, 'Would I write a check for this,' and often I vote against something because I wouldn't," he said.

"I only ask that the people not let the voting card fall into the wrong hands," the representative said.

"We're certainly not free of problems in this country - we never have been and we probably never will be."

"It's not my big secret," Hopkins said.

"Water is a big problem for Kentucky. We're going to continue working on programs to benefit the people of Kentucky."

Nicholas County Fire Chief Mark Ford (Wendell) has introduced a bill in the Senate, and I have introduced a bill in the house to offer some real solutions to come of these problems.

"The federal government is not in the water business - it is in the flood business."

"But, with the shortfall of rain over the last 10 years, the drought has magnified the problems faced by our people across the country and especially in Kentucky."

"We, as a federal government, have been putting value on flood control and overlooking the water problems. These bills should address the need to change the direction of thinking."

"The bill I have introduced will offer the governments in Kentucky some leverage. The program calls for a 50 - 25 percent program, with the federal government picking up 65 percent. Senator Ford's program is on a 50 - 50 match."

Hopkins does have some reservations, though, "Once the federal government gets into the water quality business, then it's not going to be easy."

Hopkins takes a simple stand on campaigning. "So many people running for office are not helping themselves," Hopkins said. "If you make promises to get into office, once you're elected, you're obligated to live up to them."

The unbalanced budget causes Hopkins great concern.

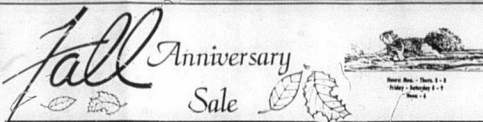
