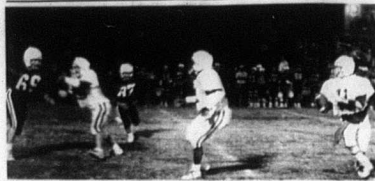

Bluejackets find Lions hard to hold back on home turf

VANCEBURG - It was a cold, cold night in Lewis County for the Nicholas County Bluejackets.
 Leading from the outset, Lewis County nabbed a first-half victory from Nicholas County in a rare Thursday night kickoff, 41-6.
 Unable to move the ball in their first possession, the Bluejackets saw things go from bad to worse, as an official's flag cost the visitors 15 yards for clipping.
 On fourth and long, the Bluejackets were forced to go into the punting game.
 The Lions nabbed the Bluejackets punt and lacked on a 20-yard return.
 Lewis County took command of the game, early. On only the Lions' second play of the game, the hosts touched a touchdown covering 20 yards.
 The Lions executed to perfection a two-point conversion, and took an 8-0 lead, to never look back.
 In the second half, the Bluejackets didn't fare much better, as Lewis County continued to control the tempo of the game. The Bluejackets continued to fall victim to officials' flags, ending the game with a total of 80 yards in penalties.
 Not until the fourth quarter, with 5:08 to go, could the Bluejackets mount a scoring drive.
 Collier Mathes grabbed a pass from Daniel Brown from 10 yards out to count the only score of the game for Nicholas County.
 Brown was three of eight on the night, as Mathes had two receptions for a total of 25 yards.
 "Our young players played well against Lewis County," NCHS Head Coach Robbie Barr said Friday morning. "Our players did the best they could against a solid Lewis County team."
 Nicholas County will remain on its tough road schedule with an 8 p.m. kickoff Friday night at Bath County in Owingsville, Friday night.

MTSU drops Morehead, 49-0
 Conference record now 2-0

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. (AP) - Freshman tailback Joe Campbell rushed for three touchdowns, and the Middle Tennessee defense held Mike Fairbanks blocked two Morehead State punts to set up scores as Middle Tennessee improved to 5-2 overall and 2-0 in the OVC.
 Blue Raider senior quarterback Marvin Collier, on Middle Tennessee's second play from scrimmage, connected with Wade Johnson for a 49-yard touchdown pass.
 Collier hit Van Dinger with an 8-yard scoring pass with 3:33 left in the first half for his second touchdown pass of the day.
 Campbell led a balanced ground attack with 65 yards on 10 attempts.
 Todd Davis, a freshman tailback, scored two touchdowns and ground out 56 yards in 10 attempts for Middle Tennessee while Johnson picked up 48 yards on the ground in 10 attempts.
 The loss drops Morehead State to 1-6 overall and 0-2 in the OVC.
