 On November 8th the voter of Kentucky can act to end the abuses of the broad form deed by voting Yes on constitutional amendment #2.

If passed, this Amendment will give landowners the right to decide if there will be stripmining on their own land.

Some coal companies have argued that an amendment limiting broad form deeds will make the state's coal industry less competitive, thereby reducing production and employment.
