Entire state declared disaster area

Gov. Wallace G. Wilkinson has announced all of Kentucky's 120 counties have been declared disaster areas by the United States Department of Agriculture.

This designation will enable eligible Kentucky farmers to obtain Farmers Home Administration (FHA) emergency loans and will also allow them to consolidate their current loans increasing them to longer terms," said Wilkinson.

In addition, Wilkinson announced that as a second part of the drought declaration, Kentucky is approved for the Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) program administered by the U.S. Small Business Administration.

The governor explained that the USDA declaration brings programs to help Kentucky farmers, while the SBA's EIDL program is to help those businesses which have suffered substantial economic injury as a result of the drought.

In asking for the assistance, the governor said he recognizes that not only had Kentucky farmers been hurt by the drought, but also many

businesses that support and are vital to the economic stability of their communities.

Registration for the G.E.D. classes and the Adult Basic Education classes will be held beginning Sept. 6th and will continue through Sept. 9th. Classes will begin Sept. 13th. Anyone interested in earning their high school equivalency diploma or just wants to improve their educational skills may enroll in this program. High school drop-outs may enroll if they are over 18 years of age and their high school class has already graduated. Classes are held at the Community Action Center (old hospital) Monday through Thursday each week from 6:30-8:30 p.m. Classes are taught by certified teachers who work individually with each student. There are no tests or homework unless the student requests it. The program is free with all books and materials furnished by the Dept. of Education and the Nicholas County Board of Education. Students are asked to attend class at least two nights per week. They may attend more often if they wish. Anyone who wishes to enroll but cannot do so Sept. 6-9 may register anytime thereafter and throughout the year. Registration forms are also available at the Community Action Center daily.

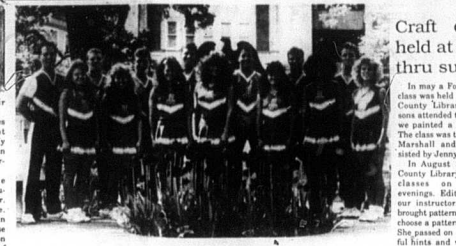
