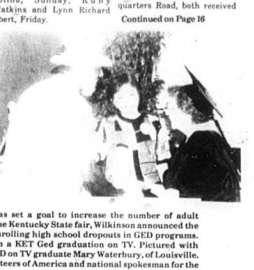
Lady Wilkinson's Army...
