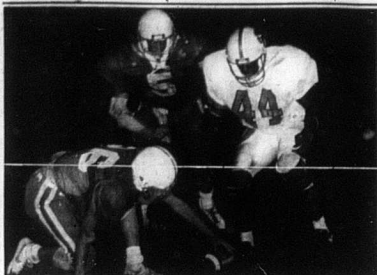

The Rams' Dan Hunt handed in a 58 yard pass from first down for Raceland's only score of the night. A two point conversion attempt, using a pass play, failed and Raceland trailed 7-6 at the end of the first quarter.

Neither team managed a touchdown in the second quarter, and the Tigers added a 10 yard fumble recovery runback for a score in the third period to end scoring.

Raceland fell to 4-2 with the loss. Raceland has lost to Paintsville and Ashland Blount High School this season.
