An exchange student from Thailand, Panada Tansul, will be attending Nicholas County High School for the 1989-90 year.

Through an exchange program sponsored by the Carlisle Rotary Club, Dr. Leon and Ginger Riggs have volunteered to keep Tansul, nicknamed June, for the year.

Riggs said arranging for the transfer was easy compared to the problems they had getting her to the Lexington airport.

"According to plan, we were to pick up June Tuesday night at 7:00. Her travel plan said she would leave her home for Bangkok by train, then fly to Japan, then Honolulu, San

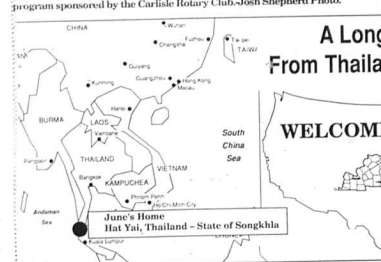
Francisco, Chicago, Lexington and then we would take her to Carlisle.
