Despite early touchdown, Nicholas falls 30-6

FLEMINGBURGH - De-

spite a quick score in the first four minutes of the game, the Nicholas County Bluejackets were defeated in their season opener against Fleming County, 30-6.

Nicholas County Coach Greg Letcher said he knew the game would show weaknesses in his team and his worries became evident throughout the game.

"This expenditure on the field really allowed But in viewing the film afterward, I didn't see that he had a game. We made mistakes and they cost us, but now that I have a chance to see the team in action, I know where we need work," Letcher said.

After offending penalties on the opening kickoff, the Bluejackets ran the ball to the 45.

In the first series Nicholas took the ground on the first three downs and on a first and 10, Quarterback Daniel Brown completed one pass to Jason Brumback who ran the ball to the Fleming five yard line. With first and goal, the Bluejackets were penalized 15 yards for holding.

On second down, Brown completed a pass to Brian Hillander, near the goal line. From there Randy Hayes took the ball in for Nicholas County's only score in the evening. The point after attempt failed.

The Fleming County Panthers ran for five yards on first down, but were three for a one yard loss on second down. On third down and six,

the Panthers ran five yards with Randy Hayes making the tackle.

However, the Panthers were called on holding and the ball was taken back and down replayed. The Panthers took to the air. The pass was completed, but defensive back Daniel Brown stepped the receiver four yards shy of a first down. Fleming opted to punt.

The Bluejackets kept the ball on the ground the first three downs. On fourth and long a Nicholas fumble gave Fleming County the ball on the NCHS 20.

On a sweep to the left side, the Panthers ran the ball for a touchdown, but missed the extra point attempt because the score tied 6-6.

Nicholas received the kickoff from the 35. Brumback and Raymond Brown ran for a total of six yards on first and second downs.

An incomplete pass on third down Nicholas went to punt. Brad Stephens received and ran the punt straight back for another TD with less than a minute left in the first quarter.

However, Fleming's attempt to run the ball for a two point conversion was thwarted. The touchdown punt Fleming 12-6.

Pat Phelps received the next kickoff and ran to the 45. Nicholas County's only score in the evening. The point after attempt failed.

The Fleming County Panthers ran for five yards on first down, but were three for a one yard loss on second down. On third down and six,

on third down, Brown attempted to pass but was caught by Fleming defenders and there for an eight-yard loss.

Farm number shows decline The number of farms in Kentucky in 1989 is estimated at 96,000, down 1,000 from the revised 97,000 farms in 1988.

The lowest level on record, but still ranks the Commonwealth fourth nationally.

The only States with more farms than Kentucky are Texas (148,000), Missouri (105,000), and Iowa (105,000).

Of the 96,000 Kentucky farms 61,000 farms had sales of \$1,000 - \$9,999 and 35,000 had sales of \$10,000 or more.

A farm is defined as any establishment from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products were sold or would normally be sold during the year.

Land in farms declined 100,000 acres from 1988 to 14.2 million acres, but continues to account for 56 percent of the approximately 25.4 million total acres in Kentucky. The 1989 average farm size in Kentucky is 148 acres.

Your baby's vision is blurred at birth. That blurriness clears up during the first few months of life, but complete visual development may take more years.

As a parent, you can motivate your baby's visual development soon after birth. In the early months, change the location of the baby's eyes every few weeks, so that the baby gets new things to look at. Hang a ball over the crib, one that will stimulate the baby to reach out and touch its colorful parts.

At about four months, give the baby assorted, safe toys of different sizes and textures. Peek-a-boo, I see you, remains a good seeing game for infants.

All babies should be allowed to crawl, explore and touch as much as possible. This helps develop hand-eye coordination long before they begin to walk.
