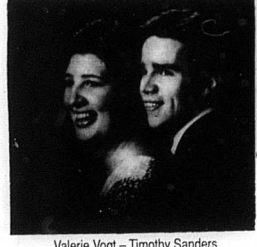

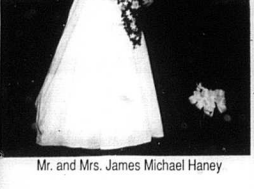

Vogt - Sanders to wed in Oklahoma, Sept. 16

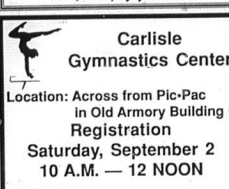

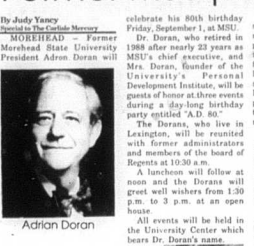
