

Lady Jackets claim first win

The Nicholas County Varsity Girls' basketball team made more trouble for themselves in the first half than the St. Patrick Saints, but the Jackets went on to control the second half and came away with an 18 point win over the Saints, 66-48.

The first quarter opened aggressively with both the Saints' Angela Tucker and the Jackets' Nikki Smoot sinking three point shots.

Earlywine came up with two two point shots as well as sinking one set 60' foul shots from the line for six points, but it was Smoot who led the scoring with four points coming from inside the three point line, though her free throw attempt just missed the net.

Christy Hatton logged four points of her own and Kim Denkins scored once to total 19 points on the Nicholas County side.

However, Denkins was unable to finish the game when four minutes in the first quarter, she twisted her ankle on the rebound and was forced to take a spectators view for the rest of the game.

On the Saints side, Tammy Whaley brought the Saints two points all well as ten from Christian Pfeiffer and another two from Allison Gallenstein.

However, it was Julie O'Hearn's two points and three times stepping up to the foul line that kept the Saints in the game trailing by a slim three point deficit going into the second quarter with the score, 19-16.

The game evened out between the Saints and the Jackets as they very nearly matched each other point for point throughout the entire eight minute period.

Smoot came up with six points in the quarter, the result of two series of foul shots and a two point basket to again lead the scoring for the Jackets.

However, the Jackets allowed two sets of foul shots to go to Tucker.

Whaley sank another three pointer. She also canned two

shots from inside the key and with O'Hearn's two points, the Saints barely edged the Jackets by one point on scoring in the second quarter.

On the Jacket side, besides Smoot, Tina Fryman made her foul shots, Amy Simons logged four points to the score.

Kristie Barton had two points as well, though she missed a one and bonus foul.

By the end of the half, the Jackets held on to a two point lead in the game with the score standing at 31-29.

Nearly midway through the third quarter, the Saints had tied the ballgame at 23-23 and maintained the pressure until Hatton moved the Jackets up by two and the Saints defense began to keep the Saints from working to the inside.

Earlywine brought the Jackets to a 41-35 lead from a quick layup under the basket while the Saints seemed locked into 25 points.

Pfeiffer was set up for a clear shot from inside the foul line, but Hatton was able to block the shot before Pfeiffer could release the

ball.

Auster moved the Jackets lead to eight with a quick move inside.

With 49 seconds remaining in the third, the Nicholas lead held at 47-35 despite two attempts to score from Fryman and Earlywine.

Hatton brought in a shot from just inside the three point line, the ball spinning its way through the net to end the quarter with the Jackets in a comfortable 49-35 lead.

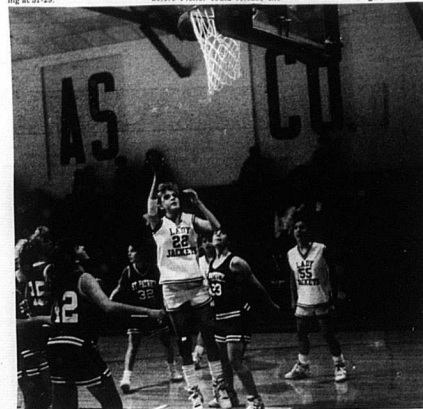
