Continued from Page 1 County quarry has good resistance, formed from crushed fossil matter and broken sand cemented well with calcite.

Far to the east, north and south of the quarry site the limestone is younger and thin-bedded, which is not practical to quarry, Dever said.

The Lexington Limestone deposits are dated in the Ordovician geological period, making them 460-480 million years old.

Lexington lime is quarried in plants near Cynthia, Paris, Lexington, Georgetown, Danville, and Butler in Pennelton County," Dever said.

Head conditions The Nicholas County Sheriff's department worked one accident during the Dec. 15 snowstorm on Morefield Road, when a pickup truck hit a Nicholas Utilities truck.

According to the sheriff's office, the KII truck sustained moderate damage and the car was severely damaged. There were no injuries.

The state highway department has damaged about 145 tons of salt and chemicals on state roads in the county.

Randy Stull, maintenance engineer for the state highway department in Flemingsburg, said Dec. 19 the conditions of state-maintained roads in Nicholas County is good.

"There is probably still a little bit of snow on priority 'C' roads," Stull said.

ation of having its limestone near the surface, unlike areas such as Bourbon and Scott County where the source of the limestone runs much deeper.

"Because the rock in the bed is so close to the surface because the rock can be more cost effectively extracted, that the greatest cost of limestone is in transportation," Dever said.

Limestone is a major product in Kentucky, Dever said. The Lexington Limestone deposit actually arches like a bow and is called the Cincinnati Arch.

Toward the tip of this arch, where older rock is exposed, erosion has exposed much of the older rock and it is increasingly useless to the north.

There are two other major sources of limestone besides the Lexington and Scott County. High Bridge Limestone is denser and more conducive to mining than Lexington Limestone because it provides a much safer roof, Dever said.

Though the Lexington Limestone is good, it is not strong and in mining, there is increased danger of collapse, Dever said.

The other deposits exist toward the southern and western regions of Kentucky, a limestone much more chemically pure than Lexington Limestone.

Though relatively younger, from the Mississippian geological period, it has very practical uses and in some applications, is much more desirable than Ordovician Limestone.

As construction material, Lexington Lime has advantages because it is softer and easier to crush than High Bridge Limestone.

It can cost less to mine. For the eastern part of the state, the Mississippian Limestone would cost too much to transport for any company to consider its use, except in special circumstances, Dever said.

"One thing about it is that there do exist somewhat isolated patches of rubble lime, but they come only in spurts and it is relatively certain beneath the rubble exist good quality, marketable limestone," Dever said.

"We called in eight extra men, six of them in Warren County, just to work all of the wrecks," said Sgt. Tommy Sizing at the state police post in Bowling Green.

The snowfall averaged between four and six inches in northern Kentucky and up to three inches in the southeast. Sleet was reported in a few western counties.

Temperatures were stuck in the teens across most of the state, except in Owensboro, where the mercury dropped to eight degrees in the late afternoon.

The snow helped early business. Stu Butler in Carrollton opened two hours early as employees filtered back Friday morning from eager skiers.

Greater Cincinnati International Airport near Hebron in northern Kentucky closed for an hour until runway could be cleared.

And racing was canceled Friday night at Turfway Park in Florence, where a

slow emergency was called, requiring vehicles to be moved off main streets.

"All the people who don't know how to drive went out last week (on the snow) and their cars are in the lady shop now," quipped Benton County Police Officer Tim Dixon.

The weather service advised Kentuckians who had to travel to allow extra time to reach their destinations, and advised those who were out to protect against bitter cold wind chills.

Plunging temperatures and surface freezing on roads prompted state government to shut down at mid-morning Friday.

It also brought a quick end to a meeting at the Capitol of the Kentucky Task Force on Education Reform.

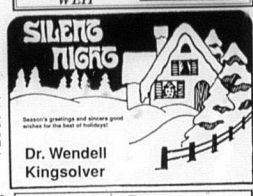
