## Replacement to be named as . . . Arnold resigns as circuit judge

Judge Jack Arnold, who has served as circuit and district judge in the 18th Judicial District in Nicholas and Robertson counties for the past seven and one-half years, has been selected for a federal position in Dayton, Ohio.

The 38 year old Harrison County native will become a United States Administrative Law Judge effective July 17.

He was notified July 3, that he was one of fourteen throughout the nation chosen so far this year for the ALJ position. Judge Arnold will report to Chicago, Illinois where he will be sworn in and then receive three weeks of orientation before assuming his duties in Dayton. Because of the federal selection, he has resigned his judgeship as of the

date of reporting to the federal post. "This is an honor and tremendous opportunity," Judge Arnold said. "Competition to become a Federal ALJ is fierce, requiring various examinations, credentials analyses, interviews, evaluation of the quality of legal and judicial experience, and other factors. I am

extremely pleased to be selected based on qualifications and also am looking forward to specializing in one or more areas of federal law." Administrative Law Judges hold formal hearings much as do state court trial judges sitting without a jury. Depending on the agency and cases the ALJ is assigned to.

The classification schedule for all employees in a certain position. City police officers, however, will all be set in an equal classification. Watson explained one purpose of the system is to bring all officers to the same level and end statewide inequities in officers' salaries.
